I am writing with good news and a follow up regarding our Project Lead the Way initiative and the arrangements I've made for that classroom and for the Logan Blade music room.

I'm pleased to let you know that the Project Lead the Way equipment and classroom will be located in a previous computer lab that we've broken down to better serve high school and middle school students. Since our high school students and teachers have been certified for DIPLOMA (1:1 devices to each student), we are able to do away with the traditional computer lab that served these high school students. I've worked closely with our Chief Digital Learning and Innovation Officer John Carver and obtained a mobile lab for our middle school students. Culleoka School will not only be able to serve these middle school students with laptops, now we'll be able to do it in a way that allows better use of student time. The computer lab will actually be coming to them! Our elementary students (K-4) lab will not be modified; that lab is still operating as usual.

The Logan Blade music room and storage that comes with that space will remain in the current room.

We are proud that our school is growing and excelling! And we realize there will always be change when schools and districts are growing. Thank you for your patience during this transition.

The growth we are experiencing is due in large part to the achievements here at Culleoka School. We strive to hit the 7 Keys to College and Career Readiness and those academic marks. Recently, the Tennessee Department of Education released growth scores and I want to share a few highlights for 9-12 grades. Level 5 is the highest growth measure assigned by the State. Culleoka Unit School achieved Level 5 in numeracy, Level 3 in social studies, Level 3 in literacy/numeracy combined. Growth in specific subjects over the last year include Algebra I and Algebra II, geometry, and chemistry. As principal, I am pleased to share this growth with you. Our teachers work to make sure all students are achieving and making progress every year.
